

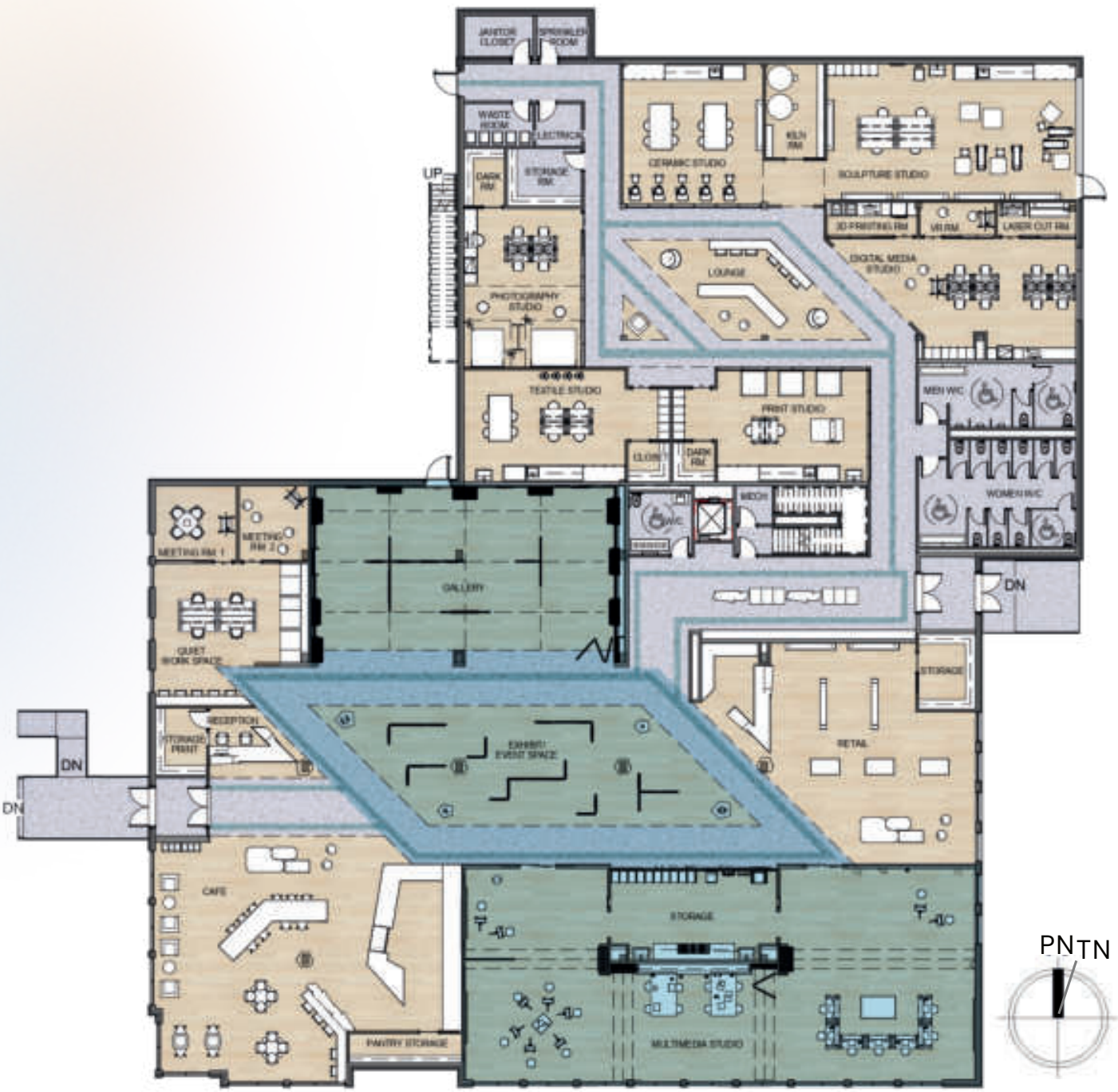

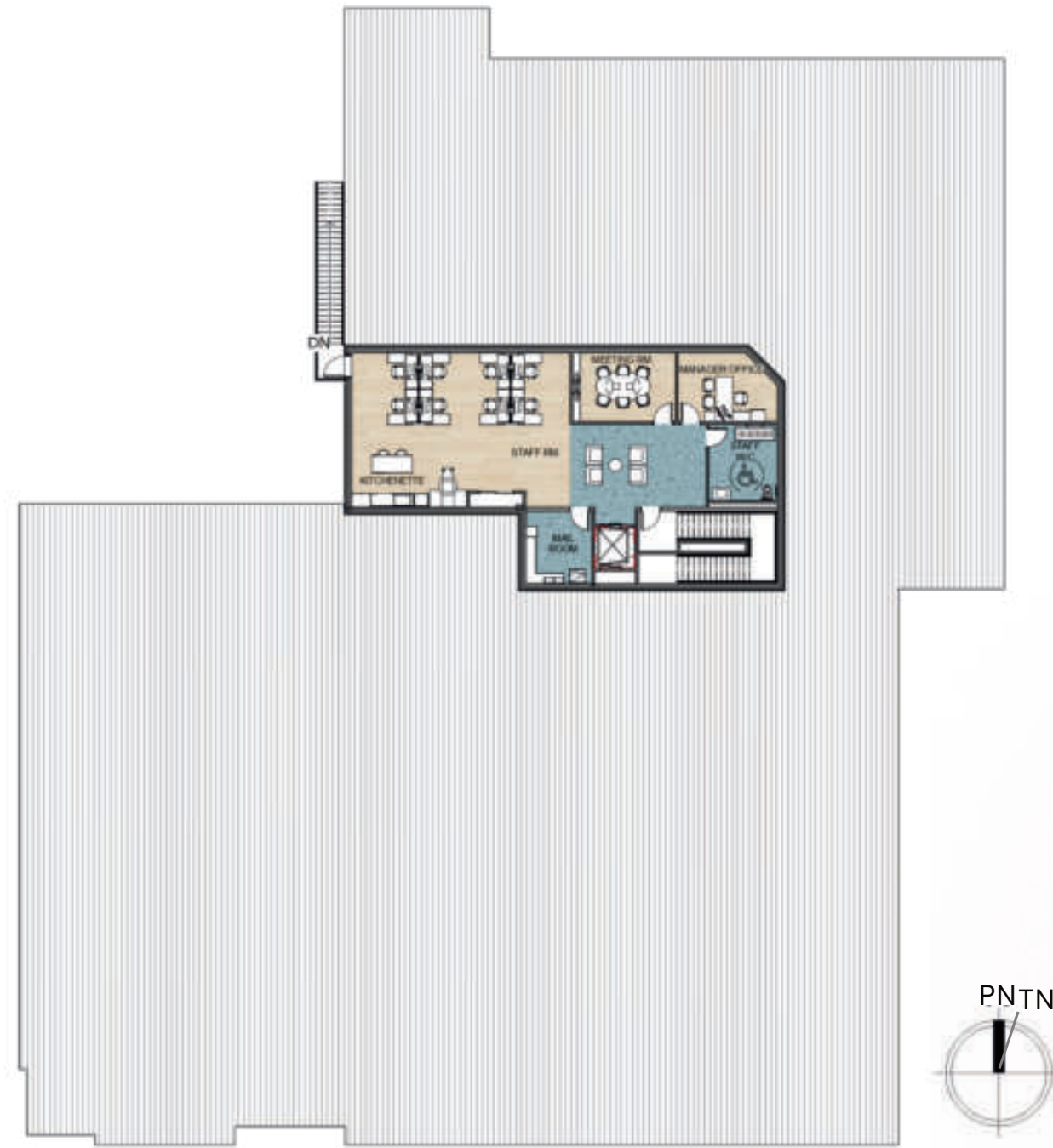
Who Are We?

SECOND FLOOR PLAN

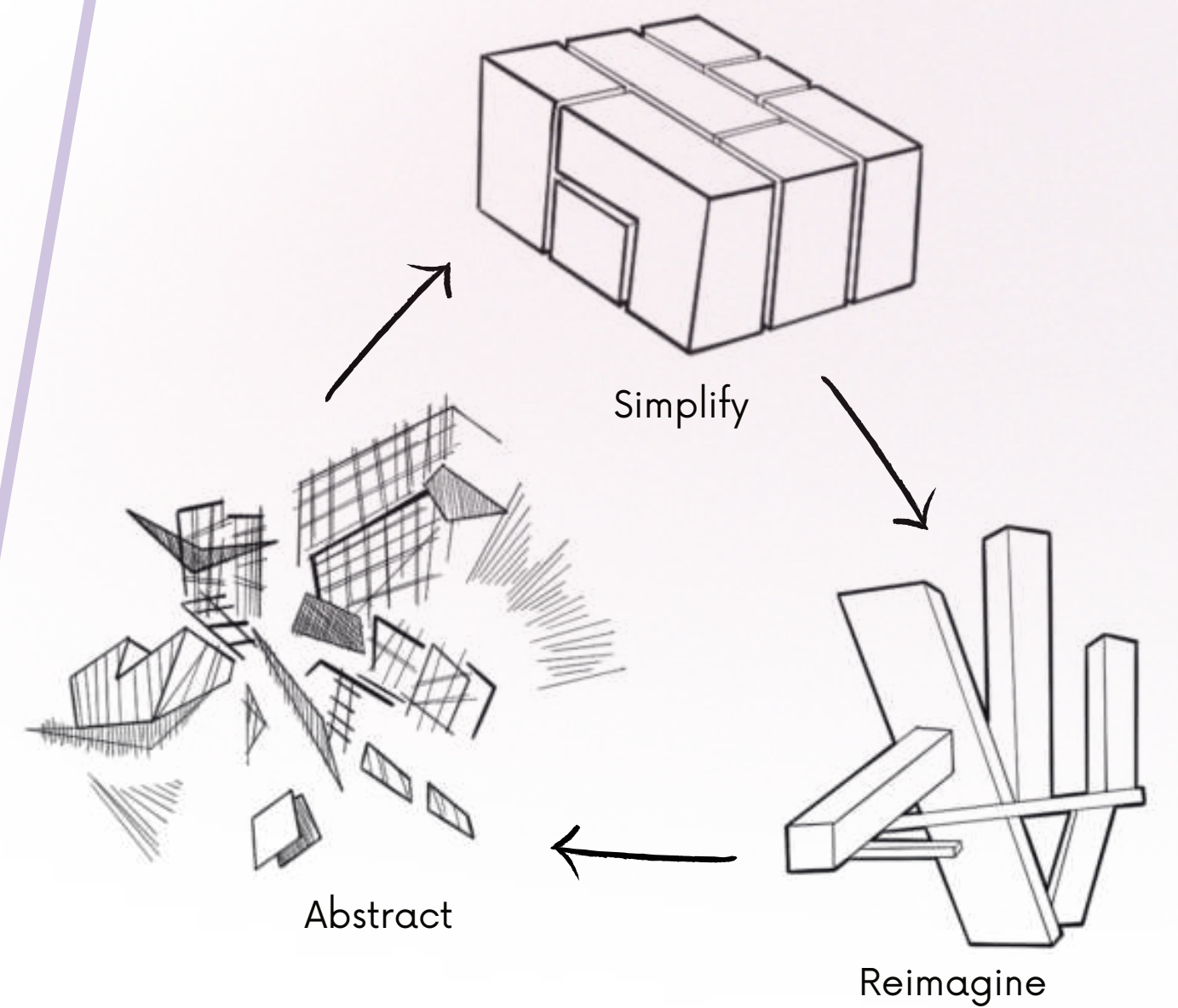

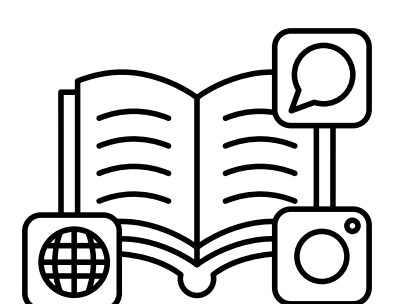
Experiential Learning:

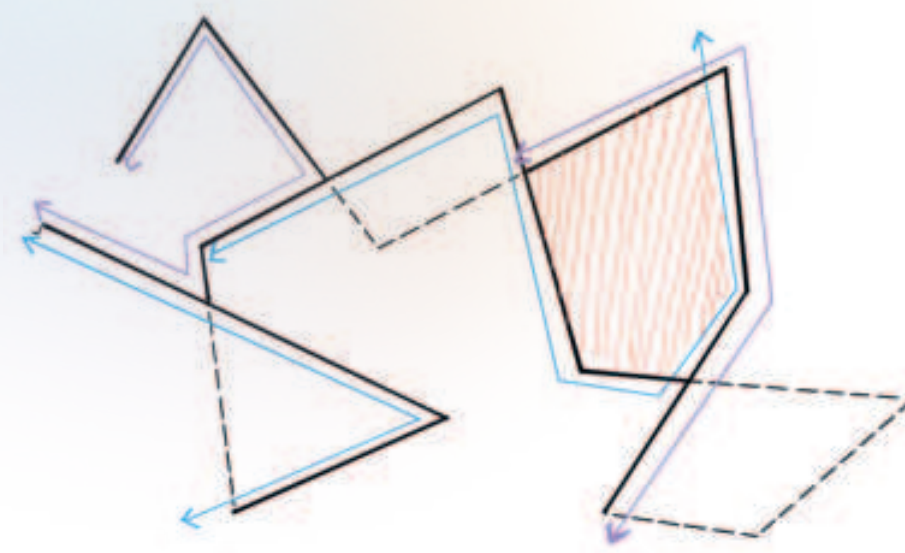
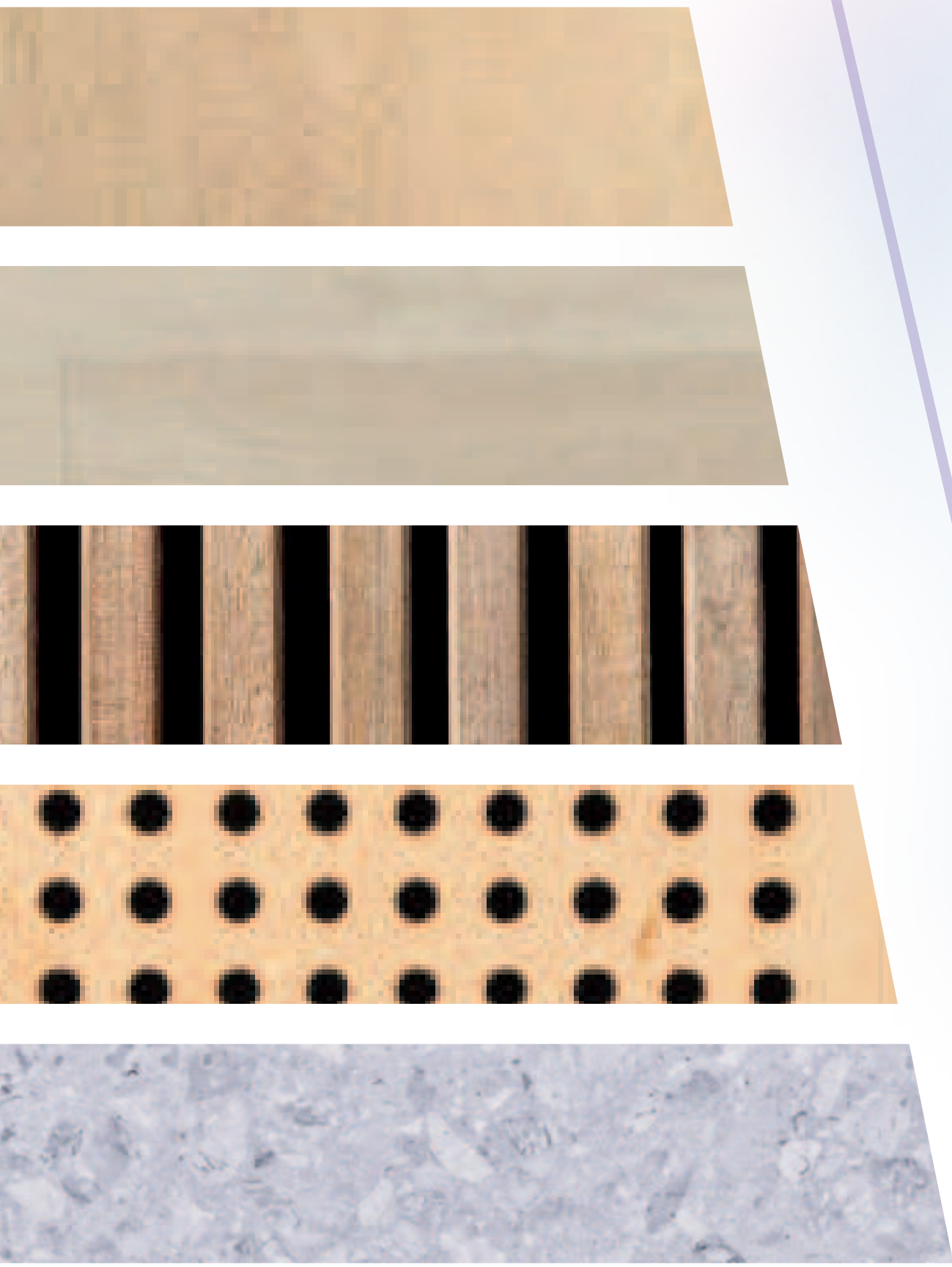
- The need for creative studios and artist-run studios are essential towards helping aspiring artists build a stable foundation within their career and promote creativity to everyone.
